Sunset Criteria - Page 2-

Item V- Whether the composition of the agency's board or commission adequately represents the public interest and whether the agency encourages public participation in its decisions rather than participation only the people it regulates:

This is noted as Not Applicable- why is this not applicable?

History of Regulation - Page 6 –

HB 19-1083 changed registration of ATs to licensing with no substantive regulatory changes made in the bill.

If there were no regulatory or substantive changes made, what recommendations would the department make to strengthen and ensure only duly licensed practitioners were licensed?

Isn't it the duty of the department to make recommendations to protect the public health and welfare?

Legal Summary – Pages 8 and 9

Page 8 – remove “or healthcare professional who treats sports or musculoskeletal injuries.” ATs are healthcare professionals who treat sports or MS injuries.

Remove the term “supervision” replace it with “consultation”

Remove the nuanced exclusions from the statute.

Program Description and Administration – Page 12

Statement about changing registration to license, with no other changes. Therefore, does the recommendation to sunset mean just for registration or the entire statute? In other words is this to delete any type of regulation for athletic trainers?

Licensing – Page 14

Table two is not coherent. Why were there no renewals in 17-18?

Did the previous statute require renewal of registrations on a biennial or annual basis?

How does the total licensees go from 869 in 17-18 to 1025 in 18-19 when there are no renewals?

This report should have had 1 table to show all types of registrations so the totals would make sense.

Analysis and Recommendations –

In the part of the statute that requires an AT to practice under the direction of a “healthcare provider”, since physician and dentist are called out, what fits under the title of “healthcare professional”?

Since ATs are noted as healthcare professionals in the act, is this necessary?

What determined the schedule this statute should undergo sunset review so soon after passage by the legislature?
